


Capture That Excitement.

Even today, the bushplane remains the only way to access many of Algoma's most coveted fishing lakes. The quintessential Canadian adventure should be on every angler's bucket list. Flying into a remote lake means travelling to a place where few have ventured. The options are limitless – from selecting backcountry outpost cabins to a full-service luxury lodge. Imagine the exhilaration of a seamless takeoff from the water, swiftly ascending where clouds frame

the sky and the breathtaking view of the landscape below that can only be seen from the air. The number one reason to choose this type of trip is to experience spectacular fishing in solitude and the peacefulness of the wild.

Regional air services are piloted by the best bush pilots that fly out of Wawa, White River, Hornepayne, Hawk Junction, Chapleau, Foleyet, Nakina, Armstrong, Hearst, Algoma Mills, Elliot Lake, and Blind River. 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
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
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Family Memories

When planning a family fishing trip we may be tempted to go to an old familiar spot. But if that spot isn't within an inspiring wilderness, where there is a very real possibility of catching quality fish, then you should consider booking an adventure to a remote fishing lodge in Algoma Country.

I've been very lucky to have spent lot of time at fishing lodges in Algoma. Some of the most rewarding times were when I was with my wife, Francine, and daughters Islay and Lillian. From before they could walk to their teens and beyond, our daughters accompanied us, and it was always clear that these fishing trips were special, providing experiences that would impact young and old for years to come.

THE FLIGHT

Lodges in Algoma can be reached by road, rail and boat, but many of the remote lodges are accessible only by floatplane. Anyone with a remote interest in aviation will be familiar with the famous de Havilland Beaver, first built in the 1940s, and the larger de Havilland Otter, originating in the early 1950s. These venerable floatplanes were produced through the 1950s and 60s and with maintenance and modernization they remain the workhorses of the North.



Even though my daughters are bushplane veterans, taking off and landing on water is always a thrill. The view from above gives us all a new perspective on the northern Ontario wilderness. Lake and river systems stretch out like long tendrils and forests are dappled with meandering wetlands. When the pilot throttles back and begins the descent, we get our first wide-eyed glimpse at our destination.

DEDICATED FAMILY TIME

Whether we are at an outpost camp on a small lake or a main lodge on larger waters, we will be staying in our own cabin nestled amongst the trees. While there may be things like Internet and a widescreen TV in the main lodge, these things are secondary to the pine charged air on the front porch of our little cabin, where days are measured by sunrise and sunset over pristine waters.

Every day is family time within the confines of the cabin and our activities include reading, sketching, whittling and breaking out guitars and singing around evening campfires. With a block of days away from civilization there is so much more time to unwind and do the activities we just never seem to have time for. And with a father obsessed with angling, a significant part of our days are spent on the water.

GO WHERE THE FISH ARE

For young families and even those new to fishing, the best way to foster a love and appreciation of the activity is to actually catch fish. Algoma lodges are located on some of the most productive waters in the province and anglers can expect to catch plenty of fish ranging from small to trophy sized. As toddlers Islay and Lillian were more interested in playing in the bait bucket than fishing. When they were convinced to hang their lines over the side, sharp tugging at the other end inspired squeals of delight. Their angling skills evolved to the point that they were catching walleye and pike on their own from the end of the dock and the next thing we knew they were out-fishing their parents in the boat. Islay and Lillian quickly learned the effectiveness of things like bottom bouncing for walleye and casting top water lures for smallmouth bass because their efforts were enthusiastically endorsed by eager fish. The techniques we master as a family at a remote lodge can be brought back to our home waters.

FORTIFYING OURSELVES

At a remote fishing lodge we can be as active or as sedentary as we want and after a few days away from civilization we fall into a groove. One way to guarantee a smooth transition into this relaxed state is to choose the level of service we want. If we want to move at our own pace then we have the option of preparing our own meals in our cabin's fully equipped kitchen. On the other end of the spectrum many lodges offer meal plans where all of our meals are served in a main dining room.

After fortifying ourselves from the bounty of the lake, my family has been known to stretch out on smooth sun-warmed rocks for a shoreline nap. A deep sleep eases us into the profoundly relaxing routine of an Algoma Country lodge vacation. Experiencing the true wilderness and great fishing as a family has proven to be a healthy way to inspire a lifelong love of angling and an appreciation for the value of wilderness.





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Drive-in Fishing



Experience That Thrill.

Drive-in fishing isn't what it sounds like. There's no lacklustre popcorn or crackling sound while you stare at a screen through your windshield. Instead, picture the ease of parking your vehicle at a lodge, where your needs are attentively met and where you can pursue the ultimate fishing experience. Algoma Country is home to some of the best drive-in fishing in Ontario.

Lodges and resorts are perfect for families, weekend escapes with friends, sizable groups, and even romantic retreats. And even after you've reached your daily catch limit, the excitement continues! Beyond fishing, many drive-in lodges and resorts offer outdoor activities like canoeing and kayaking, hiking, wildlife viewing, sandy beaches for swimming and bonfires.

In the winter, some resorts transform into destinations for ice fishing and snowmobiling—the perfect getaway from the sights and sounds of the urban buzz.





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Fly Fishing



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
The Algoma region is the Ontario hot spot for wilderness fly fishing. You can fly into remote lodges or take the train. If you want pure solitude, many operators offer outposts with cabins on remote lakes. There are also drive-in lodges with cottages offering the convenience of parking right outside your door. You can even fly fish for salmon and steelhead right in the heart of Sault Ste. Marie.

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Train-in Fishing



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Seeing a remote fishing adventure minus the flight? There are full-service lodges located along the VIA Rail line in Algoma Country, each providing an experience as unique as its location. Various departure points make this experience accessible from communities in the North.

With options to choose you can prepare your meals in a self-catering cabin, or relish in a full American Plan, complete with lodge-prepared meals and daily cabin upkeep. It's the perfect situation for anglers and outdoor enthusiasts.

These lodges along the rail line provide fishing tales for northern pike, walleye, whitefish, perch, lake trout, and brook trout. Picture a shoreside lunch, the reward after a morning's fishing adventure. When the reel grows heavy, these lodges extend nature exploration opportunities inviting you to paddle serene waters by kayak or canoe, unveiling the tranquil allure of their secluded lakes.



Hunting

Numerous Algoma resorts, lodges, and remote fly-in camps transition into specialized seasonal hunt camps with experienced guides. These hunting lodges play a pivotal role as they serve as the designated hosts for non-resident moose and bear hunters, ensuring their eligibility for hunting licences.


Algoma presents an array of hunting experiences encompassing small game, wildfowl, and big game pursuits. The spring black bear hunt in Algoma runs from May 1st to June 15th. The fall bear hunt commences in mid-August, while the pursuit of small game, wildfowl, and significant game species such as moose and deer, extends from mid-September through mid-December. 

THE COASTAL TRAIL

A strenuous hiking adventure, the Coastal Trail (63 km, or 5 to 7 days) traces Lake Superior along scenic cliffs, across cobblestone beaches, and vast forests. Several access points give you a choice of spending one or several days on the trail.

CHAPLEAU GAME PRESERVE

Cycling

If you're looking for gnarly, bold mountain bike trails in Ontario, look no further than Algoma. The region's rugged landscape is a mountain bikers' dream. The region's country roads are low-traffic and lead to charming communities with great places to eat, places to stay, and interesting attractions.



LAKE HURON WATERFRONT TRAIL

Add this trail to your list of Ontario Bucket List Rides. The bike trail leads cyclists from the shores of Lake Superior to Sault Ste. Marie, then east along Lake Huron to Sudbury, offering a varied terrain of paved and gravel country roads, Highway 17 and local trail systems. Connect to St. Joseph Island to cycle 70 km along the country roads. Stay overnight, ride the trails, and visit unique attractions and restaurants. The Adventurer's Almanac



There is no off-season for outdoor adventures in Algoma Country. Each season is distinct, and each yields amazing opportunities for those who are passionate about self-propelled activities. Algoma features some of Canada's finest skiing, cycling, paddling, hiking, birdwatching, camping and more. Here's a year-round guide to help plan your next adventure.

SPRING

Spring is a season of renewal in Algoma, beloved by paddlers and naturalists alike for wilderness canoe tripping and bird migration. The ice is out on most Algoma lakes by mid-May. There's no better way to welcome the season by canoe camping in the backcountry of Mississagi Provincial Park and the surrounding tapestry of lakes and ancient mountains north of Elliot Lake. Late spring is also prime time to descend the historic Missinaibi River, north of Chapleau. Paddling day trips are available in Wawa and Sault Ste. Marie throughout the spring, summer and fall.

Just as paddlers get on the water, millions of songbirds take to the wing, passing through Algoma on great migrations. Numerous birding hotspots are scattered throughout the region, including Whitefish Island in downtown Sault Ste. Marie and coastal wetlands on Lake Huron's North Channel, between Echo Bay and St. Joseph Island.



SUMMER

Endless country roads and flowing, custom-built mountain bike trails have put Algoma on the map as one of Ontario's best places for all forms of cycling. Get off the main highways and you'll find outstanding road and gravel riding amidst rolling hills, including the Lake Huron section of the Great Lakes Waterfront Trail, to fill long summer days. Sault Ste. Marie is a premier Ontario mountain bike destination for its challenging terrain and great scenery.

Summer is also the best time to sea kayak the Great Lakes. Experienced paddlers can journey for weeks on the pristine and rugged coastlines of Lake Superior Provincial Park discovering why Lake Superior is called an inland sea. Michipicoten Bay, near Wawa, is an ideal destination for novices to get a taste of big water; and the islands of Lake Huron's North Channel, east of Blind River, lure intermediate sea kayakers like a much wilder Georgian Bay.

FALL

A century ago, the legendary Group of Seven painters took to the Algoma wilderness by rail, canoe and foot to create Canada's most famous landscape art. Fall is the best time to lace up your boots and follow in the footsteps of J.E.H. MacDonald, A.Y. Jackson and Lawren Harris on Algoma's best hikes, including the challenging Awausee, Nokomis and Orphan Lake trails in Lake Superior Provincial Park. Make it a weekend and spend a night at the campground at Agawa Bay.

If you're a creator, bring your camera, tripod and art supplies and get inspired by riots of fall colours and epic Lake Superior storms. Algoma's maple forests are renowned amongst leaf peepers on the Agawa Canyon Tour Train; and the towering waves of crystalline water, dramatic cliffs and sweeping beaches of Lake Superior rival anything on Canada's coasts.

WINTER

Nordic ski enthusiasts in Algoma embrace the region's snowy winters. Vibrant nordic ski clubs maintain trails in most communities, including Elliot Lake, Wawa, Hearst and Blind River. Cross-country skiing in Sault Ste. Marie is renowned with over 40 km of trails at Hiawatha Highlands; and just north in Goulais River, the Scandinavian-style Stokely Creek Lodge has an incredible 120 km of trails. The Sault Cycling Club grooms over 30 km of dedicated fat-biking single-track at Hiawatha for those who love riding year-round.

Searchmont Resort and Elliot Lake's Mount Dufour feature some of the longest runs and shortest lift lines for downhill skiing in Ontario. The Algoma Highlands, just north of Sault Ste. Marie, is also emerging as one of the best destinations for backcountry skiing outside of the Rockies. For a peaceful experience, snowshoe in Algoma's many provincial parks.



Provincial Parks



Explore Parks That Vast.

Experience the stunning scenery and range of adventures in Algoma's provincial parks: Lake Superior's rugged coastline, stories of shipwrecks, the forests of the ancient Penokean Mountains, centuries-old canoe routes and hiking trails leading to magnificent panoramic views. These provincial parks protect the natural and cultural heritage of Ontario.



LAKE SUPERIOR PROVINCIAL PARK



Experience the exciting Algoma landscape painted by the Group of Seven, by hiking any of the park's 11 trails. The challenging Coastal Trail traverses the rugged headlands and rocky beaches of Lake Superior. Canoeists can choose from 7 canoe routes.



PANCAKE BAY PROVINCIAL PARK



On the shores of Lake Superior, this park boasts 3 km (1.8 mi) of sandy beach and interpretive trails like the *Edmund Fitzgerald* Lookout with views of Lake Superior, and fantastic fall colours. The park is located along historic paddling routes of the voyageurs.



BATCHAWANA BAY PROVINCIAL PARK



This day-use park is a great place to relax on the sandy beach, enjoy a picnic lunch in a picturesque setting, or launch a kayak for a short paddle on this stunning stretch of the lake.



WHITE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



Situated on a 6,500-hectare lake, White Lake is a premier fishing spot for Walleye and Pike. The park is an ideal base for exploration with 3 nature trails to explore, sandy beaches and fantastic swimming.



POTHOLES PROVINCIAL NATURE RESERVE



A day-use geological site on the Kinniwabi River, east of Wawa on Hwy 101. A short trail through a garden-like setting leads to distinctive "potholes" in the bedrock, formed by glacial meltwaters 10,000 years ago.



MISSISSAGI PROVINCIAL PARK



Home to the 130 m high Helenbar Lookout and 40 km of outstanding hiking trails that pass through a variety of landscapes and forests, with views of the Penokean Hills. Several lakes provide canoeing, boating and Trout fishing.



NAGAGAMISIS PROVINCIAL PARK



Cree for "lake with fine sandy shores", this secluded lake is a favourite fishing spot for Walleye and Pike. The park is at the heart of an ancient glacial landscape of clear blue lakes. The Boreal Forest here is home to the elusive Woodland Caribou.



MISSINAIBI PROVINCIAL PARK



Missinaibi is a Canadian Heritage River for its outstanding recreation, natural and cultural heritage. Both a huge lake surrounded by the largest game preserve in the world, and a 450 km-long heritage river, Missinaibi provides fishing, boating, canoeing, car and backcountry camping.



IVANHOE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



Ivanhoe Lake is a great family camping park and a premier boating and fishing spot. The park includes the east half of Ivanhoe Lake and 20 km of the Ivanhoe River, with a great shallow sandy beach, great birding, excellent boating and great fishing for Walleye and Pike.



FUSHIMI LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK



A quiet park known for its excellent Pike and Walleye fishing and surrounds the clear waters of Fushimi Lake. It has great swimming at one of the half-dozen sandy beaches scattered around its shores, shore lunch spots for fish fries, and some backcountry campsites.

Ski & Snowshoe



Trails & Slopes That Snowy.

Embrace the snowy wonderland that is Algoma Country with a generous blanket of ten feet of annual snowfall. Venture onto meticulously groomed ski hills, Nordic trails that weave through enchanted forests and exhilarating Telemark skiing adventures.

DOWNHILL SKIING

Algoma's rugged terrain has carved out perfect conditions for one of Canada's favourite pastimes with skiing opportunities ranging from beginner to expert. The 700-foot vertical drop at Searchmont Resort makes it one of Ontario's premier spots to ski and snowboard. Mount Dufour in Elliot Lake has a 320-foot vertical and is close to the city's downtown.

SNOWSHOEING

For the adventurous snowshoer, the winter landscape unveils spellbinding backdrops. It invites you to embark on snowshoe treks through old-growth forests, the tranquility of frozen lakes and unique ice formations and the possibility of winter wildlife sightings, a fleeting connection to the wild heart of Algoma.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING

The region boasts some of the finest Nordic skiing terrain, track and facilities in the world. Well-marked, exceptionally groomed trails lead to panoramic views in the Algoma Highlands at Stokely Creek, while frozen waterfalls and lakes abound in Hiawatha Highlands.


Touring Routes

Nicknamed "Ontario's Tail of the Dragon", this stretch of road has spectacular scenery and is renowned for curves as it hugs the banks of the Mississagi River. Part of the Grand Algoma Tour, Highway 129 links up to Highway 101 at Chapleau which takes you to Highway 17 at Wawa. This trip is ideal for any mode of travel. Experience one of the Top Ten Drives in Canada: Wawa to Sault Ste. Marie. There are so many opportunities to stop and photograph the scenery along Lake Superior.

RIDE LAKE SUPERIOR



This route forms a loop around Elliot Lake, through Blind River and Iron Bridge. Following river valleys, this route is super twisty. If you're travelling by motorcycle, this route is best suited to the adventure bike. Things to do are Fire Tower Lookout, beaches, parks, artisan tours, and historic and cultural sites.

Many colourful stories – some legend, some historical fact — are told about St. Joseph Island. It was from Fort St. Joseph that a surprise invasion took place in 1812, leading to the capture of the American Fort on Mackinac Island. Fort St. Joseph National Historic Site of Canada is a must-see stop.

Travel Information

This information is for everyone and includes border crossing information by car, boat and air. There is information about what you can bring into Canada and what you need to know about bringing the family pet. You'll find what you can take home when passing through Customs.

Know Before You Go

CROSSING THE CANADA-U.S. BORDER

All U.S. citizens aged 16 and older, entering Canada by air (including in-transit passengers who are transferring planes in the U.S.), land or water, must present one of the following documents: a passport or passport card; an Enhanced Driver's Licence; or a Trusted Traveler Program Card (SENTRI, NEXUS or FAST Card). Travellers aged 15 and under require a birth certificate for land or sea travel and a passport for air travel. For current requirements go to: cic.gc.ca.

If you are travelling with your own children under the age of 16 and your spouse, bring their birth certificates. If you are travelling with a child other than your own or without your spouse, have the child's birth certificate along with a letter of permission, including name and contact info for that child's parents/guardians or your spouse. This is needed in case Customs Officers decide to verify you have permission to bring the child into Canada. Visitors from all other countries require a valid passport and, in some cases, a visitor visa. Starting March 15, 2016, visa-exempt foreign nationals who fly to or transit through Canada will need an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA). Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travellers with a valid visa.

RESIDENTS RETURNING TO THE U.S.

If you're a U.S. resident visiting Canada for less than 48 hours, you can bring back \$200 worth of goods duty-free. For stays longer than 48 hours, the duty-free limit rises to \$800, but this \$800 limit can only be used once every 30 days. If you return for another shopping trip in less than 30 days and have already purchased \$800 worth of goods, your limit drops to \$200. People who live in the same house can combine their duty-free limits, but they must travel together. Refer to: https://help.cbp.gov/s/article/Article-246?language=en_US

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR U.S. RESIDENTS

If you or anyone in your party has a felony or misdemeanour conviction, you may not be allowed into Canada. This includes such offences as a DUI.

Your admissibility to Canada depends on the nature of the offence, how many offences you have, as well as how long ago it occurred. If this applies to you or someone travelling with you, it is imperative you contact Immigration Canada well in advance of your arrival. You will likely have to complete some paperwork and Immigration Canada authorities will then advise you of the likelihood of being allowed into Canada. The final determination of your admissibility into Canada is only made when you cross the border.

WHAT CAN & CAN'T COME INTO CANADA

Residents of the United States who visit Canada are allowed to bring in a "reasonable" amount of personal goods duty-free. The amount you bring should align with your length of stay. There are limits for some of the regulated items: Alcohol, tobacco and food products. What is and what is not allowed changes frequently -- for up to date info visit www.inspection.gc.ca for current information prior to your departure.

PETS: Dogs and cats accompanying their owners from the U.S. must have current (within 36 months) rabies vaccination certificates & appear healthy. Owners from other countries who wish to bring their pets with them should contact **1-800-442-2342 / (613) 225-2342 / TTY 1-800-465-7735** or visit www.inspection.gc.ca

VEHICLES AND INSURANCE

Any necessary permits are issued at the port of entry. If you've rented a vehicle or trailer, make sure you bring along a copy of the rental contract, which stipulates that you have permission to use it in Canada. U.S. motorists planning to travel in Canada are advised to obtain a Canadian Non-Resident Inter-provincial Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance Card available only in the U.S. Contact your local insurance agency. Note that in Ontario use of cellular and other devices is hands-free.

HOSPITALS & HEALTH INSURANCE

Most communities have hospitals and/or resident doctors. Wise travellers will check with their medical service plans to ensure they will be covered while in Canada, as health insurance plans may not extend coverage outside your country of residence. If you are taking prescription drugs, make sure that they are in the original packaging, bring an adequate supply, and bring a copy of the prescription in case you need a refill during your stay in Ontario.

If this is not possible, carry a copy of the prescription or a letter from your doctor. For more information and insurance details, contact your travel agent, insurance broker, or your employer's insurance provider.

SEAT BELTS

Ontario Law requires that adults and children over 40 lbs / 18 kg in weight wear seat belts. Infants from birth to 20 lbs / 9 kg in weight must travel in a rear-facing child restraint system. Toddlers weighing 20 - 40 lbs / 9 - 18 kg must travel in a forward or rear-facing child restraint seat.

CREDIT CARDS, FINANCIAL SERVICES AND U.S. FUNDS

Chartered banks are located in virtually all cities and towns. These full-service institutions are the best locations for exchanging currency. There is also a government-sanctioned Canada / U.S. currency exchange service at the International Bridge Plaza in Sault Ste. Marie and at the Duty-Free Store & Kiosk. Credit cards such as Visa, MasterCard and AMEX, are generally honoured in all communities. Be sure to check with individual businesses before or when booking accommodations to ensure they accept your card.

SALES TAX

In Ontario, a Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) of 13% applies to most purchases. For more information, contact:

BOATERS - HOW TO REPORT YOUR ENTRY

Pleasure crafts may enter Canada by trailer or under their own power. All boats powered by motors 10 HP or over must be licenced. Boat licences from outside Ontario are accepted. Operator Competency Requirements for Pleasure Craft – Regulation requires that all operators of motorized pleasure crafts have proof of competency and proof of age on board at all times. An operator card or equivalent, issued to a non-resident by their state or country, will be considered as proof of competency.

Planning to “land” your vessel on Canadian soil or did you leave Canadian waters and land on U.S. soil? All private boaters who intend to land on Canadian soil, or who have departed Canadian waters and landed on U.S. soil, are required to report to a CBSA designated marine reporting site. Upon arrival at this designated site, call the Telephone Reporting Centre at **1-888-226-7277** from the phone provided to obtain clearance. Not planning to “land” your vessel or did you leave Canadian waters but did not land on U.S. soil? You still need to report to the CBSA. Certain private boaters may contact the CBSA by calling the TRC at **1-888-226-7277**. For more info, visit www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/travel-voyage

SURTAX

Starting July 1, 2018, certain goods originating from the U.S. are subject to a surtax that will apply to commercial shipments as well as goods being imported by travellers above their personal exemptions. The list of goods is available on the Department of Finance website. For more information, please refer to Customs Notice 18-08, Memorandum D16-1-1 and FAQs.

LIQUOR OUTLETS AND THE LAW

You must be 19 or over to buy or consume liquor, wine and beer in Ontario. It is an offence to consume alcohol anywhere other than in a licenced establishment, your residence or within a reasonable distance of your residence. Ontario laws prohibit having open bottles of liquor in a location accessible to the driver of a vehicle. Please don't drink and drive! Liquor including wine and

beer is available through stores run by the Liquor Control Board of Ontario (LCBO) or in smaller centers, by their authorized representative. Beer may be purchased through "The Beer Store" or directly from brewery outlets. Beer, wine and cider are now available at select stores in the province of Ontario. Drinking hours in licenced establishments are from 9 am until 2 am. In Ontario, it is an offence to consume alcohol anywhere other than in a residence or on licenced premises.

Please note that driving motorized vehicles, including cars, trucks, ATVs, snowmobiles, and boats, while impaired is illegal. You can immediately lose your licence for 90 days for refusing to take a breathalyzer reading greater than 80mg (0.08%) of alcohol per 100mL of blood. Charges may be laid under the criminal code of Canada.

CANNABIS IN CANADA

Despite the fact that cannabis (marijuana) is legal & regulated in Canada, it remains illegal to take cannabis across Canada's national borders, whether you are entering or leaving Canada. For more info, consult cannabis (marijuana) legalization at www.canada.ca

- Christmas Day** - December 25
- Boxing Day** - December 26

FISHING REGULATIONS

- **Licences:** All non-residents of Canada who want to fish in Ontario require a current non-resident sports fishing licence and a non-resident Outdoors Card. Non-residents under the age of 18 may fish without a licence if accompanied by a licenced family member. Any fish caught are part of the limit of the person with the licence. Canadian residents require a resident fishing licence and a current resident Outdoors Card.

- **Bait:** You cannot bring live minnows, smelts, leeches or any other bait fish into Ontario from the United States. Night crawlers are allowed but they must be brought in containers with artificial bedding only.

- **Limits and Regulations:** With countless lakes and streams, it is important that anglers are aware of the general regulations and of any exceptions to the general regulations (e.g. specific slots or catch and possession limits) that may apply to the lake you will be fishing. Ontario's Fishing Regulations can be viewed at www.ontario.ca/fishing

HUNTING REGULATIONS

Non-residents must have one of the following to obtain a hunting licence:

- 1) An Ontario non-resident hunting licence issued to you after January 1, 1968.
- 2) A hunting licence issued to you after January 1, 1968 by a competent authority in a jurisdiction where you were a resident of that jurisdiction.
- 3) An Ontario hunting licence verification certificate showing your licence to hunt in Ontario or that you passed the hunting license examination.

FIREARMS INFORMATION

Residents of the U.S. over the age of 18 may bring a hunting rifle or shotgun into Ontario for hunting purposes. You are also allowed to bring up to 200 rounds of ammunition duty-free, or up to 1,500 rounds for use at a recognized competition. Firearms are subject to a registration fee. It is suggested that you contact the Canada Firearms Centre for information before you attempt to import a firearm. Residents of the U.S. are encouraged to pre-register their firearms prior to arriving. Handguns, fully automatic weapons, modified weapons, stun guns, mace and other weapons are not allowed in Canada. Proper storage of the firearm is important so make sure you are aware of the regulations. Of special note, firearms of any kind are forbidden in many of Canada's National and Provincial Parks and adjacent areas.
